

**Tomorrow's
Engineers Week**

8 to 12 November 2021

Overview

The ninth Tomorrow's Engineers Week (#TEWeek21) will take place from 8 to 12 November 2021.

The annual celebration highlights to young people that engineering is a creative, problem solving, exciting career that improves the world around us.

With the 2021 edition of the Week coinciding with the COP26 Climate Summit in Glasgow, Tomorrow's Engineers Week will focus on demonstrating how engineering careers can contribute to tackling climate change and achieving net zero.

The Week will feature the first ever Tomorrow's

Engineers Week Schools COP where students will come together to discuss the vital importance of achieving net zero and explore how engineers are at the heart of tackling the climate crisis.

The event will also explore how the engineers and technicians behind technological and scientific breakthroughs will be at the heart of the world's response to climate change in the coming years.

2. Tomorrow's Engineers Week Schools COP

We are inviting schools and young people around the UK to take part in the Tomorrow's Engineers Week Schools COP. It brings young people together to discuss the importance of net zero and explore how engineers are at the heart of tackling the climate crisis.

The first stage of Schools COP will be a Summit on 13 October. Schools and youth groups can nominate young people to be a climate change ambassador.

The Schools COP Summit will be released as a 30-minute broadcast on Monday 8 November and will hear from inspirational engineers that are at the forefront of tackling climate change alongside young people's

recommendations as to how engineering can help tackle the climate crisis.

Following the launch all schools will be invited to vote for the recommendation that they feel will have the biggest impact.

3. **THIS IS ENGINEERING** Day 2021

This is Engineering Day will return for its third year on Wednesday 3 November 2021.

The day is a nationwide initiative, led by the Royal Academy of Engineering, dedicated to raising awareness of the breadth of engineering. The day aims to celebrate the contribution of engineers to the world around us and to challenge narrow public perceptions of the profession.

To align with COP26 and Tomorrow's Engineers Week, This is Engineering Day will show how engineers are creating a sustainable future.

What's happening for the day

Fast forward to 2050 - How will we engineer a net zero world? How will engineering help us live more sustainably?

This is Engineering Day will stimulate conversation around these questions by sharing images of what the world around us could look like in 2050 through feats of engineering. On the day, reimagined classic artworks, incorporating future engineering technologies, will be unveiled on digital and social media, and in a physical exhibition in Glasgow, the host city for COP26.
